Know Where Our AEDs Are - It May Save a Life

We all know an electric shock can be dangerous, but did you know it can also save a life when used correctly through an Automated External Defibrillator (AED)? AEDs can bring a stopped heart (cardiac arrest) back to life by sending an electric pulse through one's chest, "resetting" the heart beat.

The Municipality has purchased and distributed new AEDs to community hubs:

- The lower level of Almonte Old Town Hall
- Mississippi Mills Childcare Services on State Street
- The Roads and Public Works Building on Old Perth Road
- The Cedar Hill School during regular operating season (Spring to Fall)*

*In the off season, this AED will be moved to the Pakenham Arena upper hall.

We're Modernizing Our Financial Methods

As seen in the promotion above, the Municipality has been encouraging residents to go paperless via e-billing, direct bank transfers, and more. Soon, the default method of receiving tax information will be electronic, starting with new residents who move to Mississippi Mills.

We strongly encourage all residents to make the transition at their earliest convenience. This transition to electronic methods will reduce processing times in the Finance Department, ultimately reducing the tax burden of residents through efficiencies.

Remember when the library was a space for reading and researching? It still is, actually, but better! It's also a safe space for young parents, community groups, youths, older adults, and everyone in-between. The Mississippi Mills Public Library (MMPL) offers a whole plethora of services and events at its two locations within the Municipality - the Pakenham Branch and the Almonte Branch. You might be surprised by the untraditional programming they offer.

Let's say that your grandchild gets you an iPad Air this holiday season - the sixth generation iPad Air comes with a 10 Gbit/s USB-C port, a Smart HDR 4K rear camera, Bluetooth

5.0 for seamless AirDropping... What does this all even mean? The MMPL can help you better understand new technology through their **Tech Tutor** service. Simply call a branch to register for an one-on-one session with a tech tutor who will help guide you through any questions or difficulties you're having with your unfamiliar technology.

The MMPL is also a space for infants and their parents/caregivers/grandparents. Every Wednesday at the Almonte Branch is **Baby Time** - a fast-paced half hour of tummy tickles, songs and bouncy rhymes. Babies and parents have time to socialize afterwards, sharing common

experiences or advice with each other. Apparently some libraries are full of fun giggles instead of silence.

In terms of borrowing, the library has a few other interesting things; **museum passes, snowshoes, laptops, skate passes, electricity usage monitors (Kill A Watt), radon testing kits, projector and screen**, and so much more. Simply put, if you ever need something specific, try the library before making a purchase.

The Municipality also ran a budget survey during the month of August. The survey received an overwhelming response from 328 participants - almost double the amount of responses compared to last year. Water Wastewater Infrastructure Master Plan

Out through your taps and in through your drains. Have a say in the master plan that'll guide "How We Flow." Until October 24, the Water Wastewater Master Plan is in its 30-day public review period. During this period, residents are encouraged to read through the document and to send any feedback to info@mississippimills.ca.

Initiated as part of MM2048, a large-scale review of many of

the Municipality's departments and services' master plans, the Water Wastewater Infrastructure Master Plan (dubbed "How We Flow") will guide the development of water and wastewater servicing. Completed by J.L. Richards & Associates, this master plan addresses the demand infrastructure will face in the coming 25 years as Mississippi Mills grows.

Focus Groups: Rural Villages and Rural Vitality

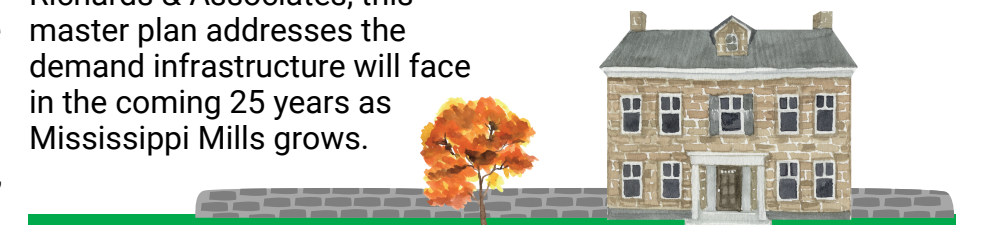

Winter Parking Restrictions Start December 1

You may already be aware that winter parking restrictions start on December 1 of each year, but did you know that it's possible for restrictions to take place before and after the annual restriction period?

In addition to no street parking and no parking in Municipal lots between the hours of 1:30 a.m. and 7 a.m. between December 1 of any year to March 31 of the following year, restrictions are in place on any days outside of the period mentioned above when snow or freezing rain is forecasted, and for an additional four days after an event where snow has accumulated.

If your street hasn't been plowed after snowfall, it's best to not park on the street overnight until it has been plowed. Keeping the roads clear of parked cars overnight helps our crews quickly and cleanly plow our streets.

the manufacturer, and a layout/floor plan/sketch of the proposed location showing the size of hearth, distances and clearances to wall and combustibles, and chimney routing.

Stay warm, stay safe.

Keeping you and your home safe Mississippi Mills Fire Department

The majority of fire deaths continue to occur in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms, says the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA).

We understand that false alarms can be disruptive to your lives. During this year's Fire Prevention Week, we shared tips on how to make alarms work for you and your life.

The Ontario Fire Marshal highly recommends alarms with a pause feature. These alarms are one of the safest ways to enjoy your cooking, showering, or whatever other activity you may be doing that occasionally trips the smoke alarm.

By using the pause feature just before starting your activity, you can temporarily silence the alarm without disconnecting the power source. The alarm will go back to protecting you and your home after the set period of time. Check your alarm to see if yours has this feature, and consider upgrading if it doesn't.

Don't leave your survival to chance - when purchasing a smoke and carbon monoxide alarm, make sure you buy an alarm that meets Canadian standards.

Look for one of these logos on the alarm itself (not just on the package): **CSA**, **cUL**, or **cETL**.



If purchasing a new alarm with a pause feature isn't an option, consider moving around some of your alarms. If your alarm is activating often during your everyday activities, you may have placed it too close to your bathroom, window, ceiling fan, or heating and cooking appliances.

Moving the alarm a short distance away can make all the difference.

As a reminder, it is required by law for every home in Ontario to have a working smoke alarm on every storey (including basements) and outside all sleeping areas. Failure to comply can result in a \$360 ticket or fine of up to \$50,000 for individuals or \$100,000 for corporations.

It is the landlord's responsibility to ensure their rental properties comply with the law. If you are a tenant of a rental property and do not have the required number of smoke alarms, contact your landlord immediately.

It is against the law for tenants to remove the batteries or tamper with the alarm in any way.

- Place candles in sturdy holders, and keep away from anything flammable (beds, trees, table cloths, etc.)
